UNGASS Resource Needs Estimates

- Government and civil society representatives meet for a Special Session of the General Assembly of the United Nations (UNGASS) 25 to 27 June 2001 to consider an expanded response to HIV/AIDS. This policy forum estimates that by 2005, that response will require about US\$9 billion annually, with half of these resources needed in sub-Saharan Africa.




Global Spending on HIV/AIDS












Windhoek General Hospital

VCT: \$8 or \$800?






Minimum Package of Services or Should We Shoot for More?


